

Grand Opening Ceremony cum Welcome Dinner

The International Infrastructure and Projects Leaders Summit (the Summit) served as a vital platform for global leaders to engage in meaningful and impactful discussions on infrastructure development and set a new benchmark for dialogue and collaboration in the infrastructure sector. The Grand Opening Ceremony on 14 November, officiated by The Honourable Paul Chan Mo-po, Financial Secretary of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, set an engaging tone for the event. The following day, the launching of the Summit featured remarks from Ms Bernadette Linn, Secretary for Development, and Mr Li Liangsheng, Vice Ministry of the Ministry of Water Resources in China, who welcomed over 500 esteemed leaders and experts from more than 20 countries and economies. The theme of this year's Summit was "Strategic Leadership in Managing Complexity and Uncertainty in Infrastructure Delivery".

Presentation and Plenary Session Highlights

Three presentation sessions featuring comprehensive sharing from world-class leaders:

1. The Latest Policies and Strategies for Upcoming Infrastructure Delivery Plan

This presentation session outlined the latest policies and strategies to enhance infrastructure delivery, focusing on effective project governance and innovative ideas and technologies for managing increasingly complex mega projects. Speakers from Mainland and overseas countries highlighted their approaches and initiatives in addressing global challenges in this ever-evolving infrastructure landscape.

2. Striving for World-Class Delivery of Infrastructure Projects - How Big Things Get Done!

The presentation underscored the necessity for strategic leadership and robust partnerships in navigating the complexities of major projects within a rapidly evolving landscape. Insights were shared on fostering trust and leveraging collective intelligence to drive visionary projects forward through case studies.

3. Challenges and Opportunities of Mega-Infrastructure Projects

This presentation session explored different challenges and opportunities linked to mega-infrastructure projects, and how major project leaders navigated complex issues and uncertainties for project success. It highlighted the adoption of innovative approaches and examined the strategic significance of far-reaching major development plans for enabling sustainable development of a city.

Three plenary sessions provided in-depth and insightful discussions on:

1. The Next Growth Curve: Pivoting Infrastructure for City Development

- highlighting the critical role of infrastructure in driving the city development and the next wave of global economic growth

2. Powerful Partnerships: Collaboration for Project Success

- exploring effective financing and procurement strategies essential for advancing infrastructure projects within a culture of collaboration


3. Building Tomorrow: Embracing Innovation and Digitalisation

Site Visit Highlights

Before closing the Summit, distinguished Mainland and overseas guests participated in an exclusive site visit to world-class on-going infrastructure projects in Hong Kong. They visited Trunk Road T2 and the Cha Kwo Ling Tunnel Project, showcasing innovative engineering solutions and advanced technologies, and visited the Central Kowloon Route, a key transport infrastructure aimed at significantly improving connectivity and reducing traffic congestion in busy areas. The tour also included the Kai Tak Sports Park, designed to offer world-class sports and entertainment and enhance community engagement with splendid facilities.
